Whilst our church buildings remain closed, we continue to meet and worship regularly using social media (Facebook and Zoom). We are now pleased to add a Sunday Service that you can access simply by making a call on home phone.

The service of Morning Prayer, which will last 25-30 minutes, is at **9.30am each Sunday** (starting Sunday May 10th). The words for this service are here, too, so you can join in.

How to dial in to the service by telephone:

- 1. Dial **0330 336 0036** from either a landline or mobile phone (The call will cost the national rate, or if you have a contract with 'minutes' it will come from your allowance at no extra cost.)
- 2. You will be asked for your PIN number. Using your telephone keypad, enter **866271**
- 3. You may be asked to say your name
- 4. Then you will be connected with us and be able to follow and join in with our service.
 - Remember that you can be heard by the others there!!
 - You may find it easier to put your phone on 'speaker' so that your hands are free.
- 5. When the worship is over (or if you need to leave sooner) just hang up. Thank you for worshipping with us!

Greeting

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you **and also with you.**

Prayers of Penitence

The minister introduces the confession. Lord God, we have sinned against you; we have done evil in your sight. We are sorry and repent. Have mercy on us according to your love. Wash away our wrongdoing and cleanse us from our sin. Renew a right spirit within us and restore to us the joy of your salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

May the Father of all mercies cleanse *us* from *our* sins, and restore *us* in his image to the praise and glory of his name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Praise

Let everything be said and done in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God through Jesus Christ.

Sing psalms, hymns and sacred songs: let us sing to God with thankful hearts.

Open our lips, Lord: and we shall praise your name.

Canticle: Venite – a Song of Triumph
