Reflection

During this time think through the events of the past year, all that has happened in your life. Focus on the ups and on the downs. Ask yourself '*what has given me life*' and '*what has drained me*'.

When you are ready, place one of your stones by your candle, remembering that stones often mark our journey. This stone represents the joys and the sorrows of the past year. As you place it, say quietly to God '*I offer you the whole of me, because you love the whole of me*'
